TEACHING EXPERIENCE

Your Life as a Story: Writing the Book-Length Memoir, WriterHouse, Charlottesville, VA, Spring 2014-present

Eight-week courses that teach students how to use exposition, scene, and reflection to transform their life experiences into stories that are as compelling as fiction. In each class, students workshop excerpts from their books, analyze the craft of nonfiction masters, mine their memories using writing prompts, and learn how critiquing the work of others can improve their own writing.

Memoir in a Year, Part 1, WriterHouse, Charlottesville, VA, January 2015-present This generative year-long class is designed to help participants write a full draft of a book-length memoir in twelve months. In each class, we study memoir craft and technique, analyzing published books as models; workshop key scenes; and follow in-class writing exercises.

Memoir in a Year, Part 2, WriterHouse, Charlottesville, VA, January 2016-present A continuation of Memoir in a Year Part 1. Students revise the first draft they wrote in Year 1.
